In the early weeks of 2025, I wrote an extensive summary of 2024 considering my goals, successes, and failures for the year. Today, more than halfway through 2025, I regret having lost that record of my thoughts, and in this essay I endeavor to record how 2024 passed and the goals I held entering 2025.
